**Obediah Satterwhite was born in Georgia on February 2, 1790**

**Mary Polly Green Satterwhite wife of Obediah was born in Alabama on October 26, 1796**

**John W. Echols future son-in-law of Obediah was born in Alabama in Chambers County in 1811**

**Obediah Married Mary Polly Green Satterwhite about 1812**

**Obediah and Mary Polly Green Satterwhite had their first child Nancy Satterwhite Daniel in Georgia in Jones County on October 26, 1812**

**Samuel Moore Echols future son-in-law of Obediah was born in Alabama in Chambers County on September 18, 1815**

**Obediah and Mary Polly Green Satterwhite had second child Martha Satterwhite Echols in Georgia in Jones County in 1819**

**Obediah Satterwhite appears on the census in Georgia in Jones County in 1820**

**Obediah and Mary Polly Green Satterwhite had their third child Lucy Ann Satterwhite Echols in Georgia in Jones County in 1821**

**Obediah and Mary Polly Green Satterwhite had their fourth John Henry Satterwhite in Georgia in Jones County on May 20, 1822**

**Sarah Mary Black Satterwhite future daughter-in-law of Obediah was born in Georgia on April 16, 1824**

**Obediah and Mary Polly Green Satterwhite had their fifth child Amy Satterwhite Thompson in 1826**

**Obediah was an Organizing Member Mount Zion Church Georgia in Troup County (land lot 231 of 7<sup>th</sup> district) October 13, 1829**

**Obediah was a Mount Hickory Primitive Baptist Church Alabama in Chambers County Deacon 1847**

**Obediah's will is on file in Dadeville, Alabama in Tallapoosa County at the Court House Dated May 17, 1853**

**Edward Satterwhite brother of Obediah died in Georgia in Harris County on December 20, 1854**

**Samuel Moore Echols was captured in Resaca, Georgia while serving in Company B Twenty Ninth Alabama Infantry Confederate States of America on May 16, 1864**

**Samuel Moore Echols died a Prisoner of War at Alton, Illinois in Madison County of Typhoid June 29, 1864**

**Samuel Moore Echols was buried soon after in North Alton, Illinois in Madison County at Alton State Cemetery**

**Obediah was buried soon after in Milltown, Alabama in Chambers County at Mt. Hickory Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery**

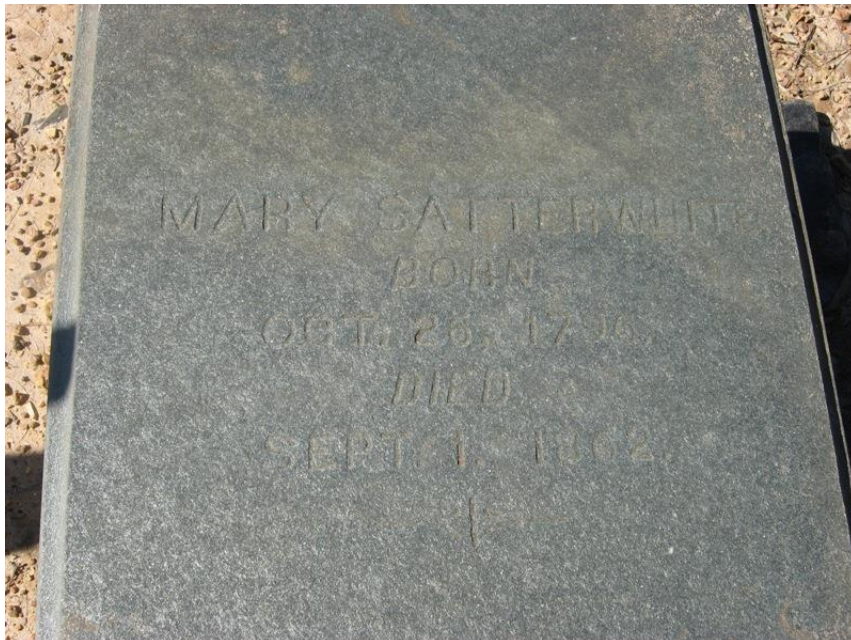
